## Assignment Three - "Killing Two Birds with One Stone"

Develop the lighting design for one of three possible projects. The three project options are....

Option A - Your Current Studio Design Project

Option B - A Past Studio Design Project

Option C - "Loft" Project (provided by me)

The intent of further developing your architectural or interior design studio project is an opportunity to show me how lighting (both natural and electric) influenced, compelled, conceived, or is incorporated into your studio design. Also is an opportunity to enhance and improve your design exploration. Since light defines what you see, your project sketches, renderings, and perspectives should show your intent on how light can reveal or transform your spaces.

You are required to develop and document your lighting design for the primary portion of your project (ie... if you designing a restaurant, concentrate on the main dinning area; if you designing a retail environment, concentrate on the main selling areas; etc. – further development of secondary or back of house spaces are optional.

  - If needed, additional supplement or further elaboration to explain your lighting concept (ie drawings, sketches, perspectives, images, etc.)
